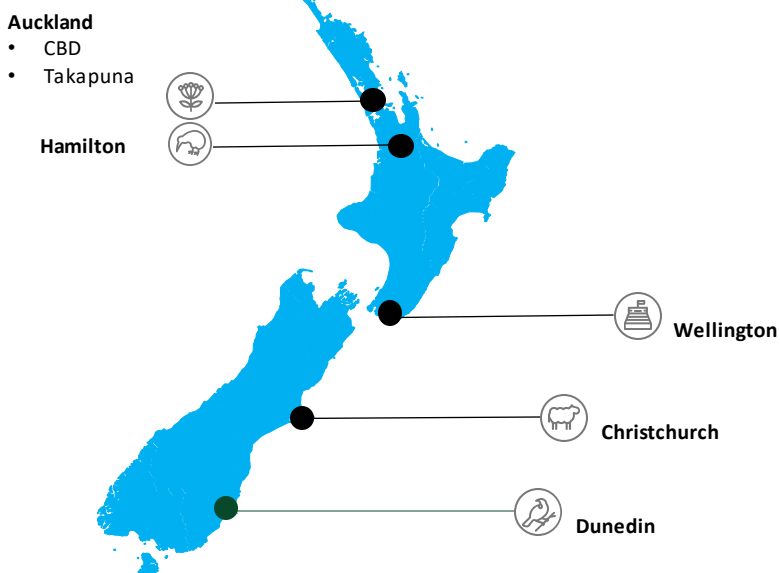

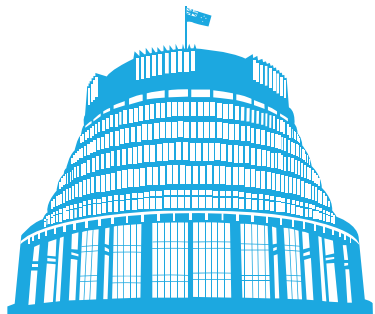
What could I be doing?

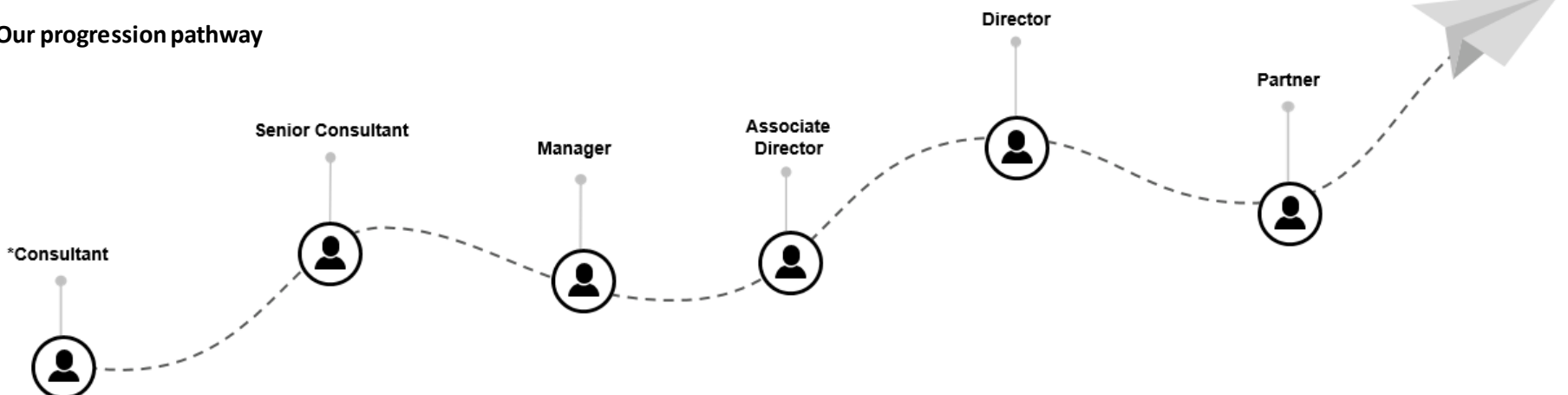
